Children's Cancer Support

The charity was founded 38 years ago by a group of parents who recognised the need for a support group specifically for children being treated with cancer at Alder Hey.

Everyone involved with running and the administration of CHICS has had a child diagnosed with and treated for cancer. There are 3 separate charities under our banner that cover Liverpool and the wider NW area, The Wirral and North Wales.

The aim of the charity is to provide holistic support to the whole family, the sick child, parents or carers, siblings and extended family, from cancer diagnosis and continuing for as long as they feel they need our support.

CHICS offer all sorts to the families: Working on the Alder Hey Oncology Ward to support inpatients and meet new families, Supporting the Outreach and Palliative Care team at Alder Hey, Support for the Play Specialist on the Oncology ward - toys, vouchers, electronics etc, Bereavement grants and support for families who lose their young one and Hardship grants or specialist equipment for our most vulnerable families. North West Radiotherapy Operational Delivery Network

The Children's radiotherapy service, for patients in Cheshire and Merseyside, successfully transferred from The Clatterbridge Cancer Centre to The Christie on 31st March 2023 for all paediatric radiotherapy patients. The introduction of Proton Beam Therapy to the UK and increased commissioned indications of PBT, saw a subsequent reduction in the number of children being treated with photons at centres like Clatterbridge, that would no longer be compliant with the service specification. This coupled with the risk of single handed practice supported a case to transfer the service.

A multidisciplinary team with members from providers, the Radiotherapy ODN and specialised commissioning worked together to secure a quality and resilient children's radiotherapy service.
