NW CHILDREN'S & TYACANCER CONFERENCE EVALUATION

Overview

This conference was the second event to take place for the North West Children's Cancer Operational Delivery Network and the Teenage and Young Adult Cancer Network. The conference took place on the 7th March 2025 at the Spine, Liverpool, and was organised in collaboration with the Cheshire and Merseyside Cancer Alliance, this years hosts, Lancashire and South Cumbria Cancer Alliance and the Greater Manchester Cancer Alliance.





Left: The bar chart shows a breakdown of delegates by Staff Group.


Below: The pie chart shows a breakdown of delegates by location.



DELEGATE FEEDBACK

51 of the 96 attendees completed the feedback form, giving a **response rate of 53%**

When asked how relevant the content of the agenda was to their role, with 1 being not relevant at all and 10 being very relevant/ transferable, the delegates responded:



Analysis of the outlying response shows that the delegate felt the sessions were too localised and not transferable to their area of work.

97% of the 51 responses were Somewhat or Very Satisfied across all questions. Analysis of the 3 Somewhat Dissatisfied responses shows that 2 delegates felt the sessions were too localised and not transferable to their area of work but unfortunately, the single responder did not provide any detail to why they were Somewhat Dissatisfied with the preconference information.
